President's Message

Compatriots,

October was a busy month. We participated in two educational public outreach events. Compatriots Joe Segar and John Lynch formed part of a panel for a Williamsburg Area Genealogical Society (WAGS) presentation "Revolutionary War Ancestors" at the College of William and Mary's Osher adult learning program. The second was a genealogical workshop sponsored by the James City County 250th Committee and local chapters of the SAR and DAR; compatriots Ron Adolphi, Hunt Berryman and Ron Miller supported this workshop. Our annual participation in the Yorktown Day celebrations was truncated this year by the federal government shutdown. The popular parade was canceled and for several reasons the Thomas Nelson commemoration had to be moved to York Hall. Despite these changes the Nelson commemoration was a success. Compatriots Gary Dunaway and John Lynch formed part of the VASSAR color guard supporting the reinternment of Eliza Monroe Hays, daughter of President James Monroe, at Hollywood Cemetery on 23 October 2025. Eliza Hays' remains were repatriated earlier this year to the United States from Paris, France, where she had been buried in an unmarked grave. Colonial Williamsburg Foundation has kept us apprised of the work at the Palace Cemetery. An excerpt from the most recent correspondence:

While we have identified burials in each of the test units we have excavated so far, they are not in the locations that we thought they would be based on the historic maps. Therefore, we will need to expand our excavations in order to expose a few more burials so that we can definitively identify which of the burials mapped during the 1930s excavations we have found. Unless the maps are very wrong, we should be able to complete these excavations and refill our excavation units within the next two weeks, weather permitting.

We are in process of coordinating a special service at Bruton Parish to honor these patriots.








We currently have 12 new member applications and 10 supplemental applications under review for approval.




Revolutionary War History of the Month Submitted by Stuart Butler, Chapter Historian

Between the latter weeks of March and early April 1781, the counties of the Northern Neck of Virginia were the scene of repeated and destructive raids that appeared to its inhabitants as piratical and wanton destruction. The British flotilla consisted of six vessels, most likely sloops or brigs outfitted with twelve to eighteen guns each, along with about six smaller vessels. The flotilla was dispatched by British General William Phillips (1731-1781) after he arrived in Hampton Roads with 2,000 troops. The primary purpose of the flotilla was to prevent Maj. General Lafayette from crossing the Potomac with additional forces to join other Virginia militia in opposing General Cornwallis' advance into Virginia.

No sooner had the raids started to penetrate the upper Potomac in late March, they were all gone by the middle of April. However, before that, many Potomac plantations were raided, homes and outbuildings destroyed, and livestock stolen. But the most expensive loss to Virginia's planters was the scores of runaway enslaved people who took every opportunity to escape aboard British vessels. The flotilla's victims also included plantations in Maryland as well. The flotilla was commanded by British Capt. Richard Graves who commanded the fleet from his warship, HMS Savage. British vessels under his command came as high as Alexandria before retreating down the river. Even portions of the Mount Vernon estate were not spared (see next newsletter). Several of the enemy vessels were captured, and their crews taken and sent either to Fredericksburg or Alexandria. Reports received by Governor Jefferson, especially from Henry Lee (General Lee's father) and Richard Henry Lee, detailed the devastation inflicted by enemy vessels on the Northern Neck counties of Westmoreland, Northumberland, and Stafford. Many of the reports requested that the governor provide more arms and ammunition to the beleaguered militia, who proved inadequate to prevent the raids.

Despite British strategy to disrupt or prevent altogether Lafayette's forces from crossing over to Virginia, it did disrupt or upset the regularly scheduled militia call-up to assist Continental efforts to oppose Cornwallis advance. Simply put, many of the militia in northern Virginia had to be diverted to protect the Potomac counties instead of moving south. A further footnote to the story of the Savage was that it was defeated in one of the most hard-fought ship duels in the war and captured by the American privateer Congress on September 6, 1781, off Charleston, South Carolina. Six days later, however, Congress and her prize, Savage, were taken by HMS Solebay, a 28 gun frigate which shepherded both

year





Founding Martyr: The Life and Death of Dr. Joseph Warren, the American Revolution's

Lost Hero

by Christian Di Spigna

Date of book. Aug. 14, 2018, 322 pages

A rich and illuminating biography of America's forgotten Founding Father, the patriot physician and major general who fomented rebellion and died heroically at the battle of Bunker Hill on the brink of revolution. Little has been known of one of the most important figures in early American history, Dr. Joseph Warren, an architect of the colonial rebellion, and a man who might have led the country as Washington or Jefferson did had he not been martyred at Bunker Hill in 1775. Warren was involved in almost every major insurrectionary act in the Boston area for a decade, from the Stamp Act protests to the Boston Massacre to the Boston Tea Party, and his incendiary writings included the famous Suffolk Resolves, which helped unite the colonies against Britain and inspired the Declaration of Independence. Yet after his death, his life and legend faded, leaving his contemporaries to rise to fame in his place and obscuring his essential role in bringing America to independence.

Christian Di Spigna's definitive new biography of Warren is a loving work of historical excavation, the product of two decades of research and scores of newly unearthed primary-source documents that have given us this forgotten Founding Father anew. Following Warren from his farming childhood and years at Harvard through his professional success and political radicalization to his role in sparking the rebellion, Di Spigna's thoughtful, judicious retelling not only restores Warren to his rightful place in the pantheon of Revolutionary greats, it deepens our understanding of the nation's dramatic beginnings. Christian Di Spigna is a writer based in New York City and Williamsburg, Virginia. A regular speaker and volunteer at Colonial Williamsburg. Di Spigna is an expert on the history of the era and educates a wide array of audiences.
